Barrington	H	A	It is appropriate for Barrington to be zoned for Godwin based on distance from our Church St. entrance to the school - approx. 1 1/2 miles. It is however a shame that our neighborhood is being rezoned after 7 years.
		C	I think feeder patterns are important to consider with Church Run attending Pocahontas. I think they maybe the only neighborhood being sent to Tucker. They are certainly closer in proximity to Godwin there will be more community support to have them at Godwin. It's also a safer option as far as travel is concerned.
		D	Still have concerns that Gayton Station only school being pulled to Deep Run. Should go to Godwin - Church Run students ONLY students leaving PMS and sent to Tucker. They should stay w/peers and go to Godwin.

	H	C	disrupts the continuity through K-12: ES will be Davis then most of the kids will attend Byrd or Tuckahoe for middle school except for our neighborhood which will attend Pocahontas. Then our children will attend Tucker HS while all other students will attend Deep Run or Godwin.
		GC	Godwin is preferable because it is much closer geographically and uses Church Rd as a border.
Bennington Ridge	E	A	This option projects the highest for Gayton which would make the student to teacher ratio too high for an elementary school.
Berkeley	H	A	Only one middle school feeds Deep run on this option? River's Edge community should stay in Deep Run - they have no sense of community with Staples Mill area.
	M	GC	Boundaries for A, B, C too far east. Neighborhoods sent to Tucker High School will be attending Short Pump Middle School, but then go back to Tucker for high school?
Between Three Chopt and Patterson (on Skipwith)	M	A	This is the only option I feel very strongly against. It takes our kids from Tuckahoe Middle which is nearly in walking distance across the county to Brookland. This would affect relationships made in elementary, Break them in Middle, then break them again in high school
Branway-Heathfield Rd	M	D	This option is not good for our area because it puts our kids with a different group of neighborhoods than they were with in elem. School and hen back with that same group for high school. It seems to be the most disruptive of all the options for our neighborhood.
Bretton Woods	H	A	Too big! No room for growth.
		A	Option A seems to put the new HS at 100% capacity by 2013. That is a negative. It cuts the Hungary Creek MS cohesiveness in half.
		D	Glen Allen is ok for new school, but Tucker's area pupils from too many areas--crossing too many major highways.

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Bretton Woods	M	B	Do not like as travel to Brookland is too far versus HCMS just around the corner.
		B	I don't like this plan at all. It keeps Glen Allen together but pulls from too far elsewhere, too much splitting of neighborhoods.
		C	Not the best use of capacity (65% in 2010?). Worry about budget/funding --> large drop from 95% in 2009. What happens to the teachers?
Bridgewood	M	A	Kids from St. Mary's Hospital area should not be bussed all the way to Brookland - it is too far.
		B	Kids from the Skipwith area should not have to be bussed all the way to Hungary Creek. That's insane! Let them continue at Tuckahoe as it is closer.
		D	You have split the Broad Meadows/Bridgewood/Kingston neighborhoods. These are one continuous neighborhood. Why not make the boundary for Hungary Creek to be east of Cox Road and North of Broad St. There should be no need to split neighborhoods. Our middle school (Hungary Creek) is 4 minutes from my house whereas Short Pump is over 20 minutes (more with the traffic). There were no other options presented for our neighborhood.
Bridlewood	H	D	For Godwin/DR area - why cross Broad to add into Godwin on one side then cross Broad on another to pull into DR? Cox Rd should be the boundary. Crossing Broad should not be an option - it is easier transportation wise to cross 64 on Nuckols then to cross Broad at Pump.
Brittany	E	D	Makes no sense to move Brittany and Dove Hollow to Longan.
	H	A	I don't understand why natural boundaries (i.e. public roads) are not being used to determine districts and it chops into certain subdivisions. It also puts new HS at highest capacity to begin with and maxed out by 2013. Puts need for bus routes to be chopped up along Hungary Rd.
		A	I think the way the line cuts into some sub divisions and not others is very confusing. I think it should follow the major roads such as Hungary, Staples Mill and other major roads. The balance is not as good. The new HS is maxed out by 2013 in an area that is growing rapidly.
		A	It splits kids coming from HCMS between Hermitage and the new school.
M	A	Stretches HCMS boundary too far west (north of 295) to what would logically be Brookland territory.	
Brookley East	E	A	The boundary lines do not seem to be as equally placed. Some of the divisions including that for Echo Lake seem to be an awkward cut.
		B	Not sure why you would carve out one little neighborhood on the other side of Staples Mill and send them to GAES.
		C	Seems natural to use Hungary Road as a key dividing line. In most options A, B, C - it does not seem to be a reason to carve out the neighborhood (Wittshire Dr.) etc - and exclude that subdivision from Echo Lake.
	M	B	Decreases opportunity for all kids. Increases safety issues when kids are treated equal.
		B	Option B appears to greatly split up ES students to attend middle schools that are further than other middle schools.
		E	Takes kids right next to Mt. Vernon Middle over to Brookland.

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Burgundy Park	H	A	My concern is this is my neighbors behind me in Hardings Trace and my neighbors across the street in Wellsley are going to Godwin. Your are breaking up a community. All the kids my children play with and have known for years will to to a different school.
	M	C	Will break up a community that is very tight not to mention the hardship from a traffic standpoint. Crossing Broad St is very dangerous during rush hour. This puts a strain on working parents trying to get to school to pick up children. Do not need more drivers crossing Broad when there is a better option closer and makes sense.
Candlewood	E	A	Do not support. This option splits the neighborhoods currently attending Pemberton Elementary.
		GC	Option B & D splits the neighborhoods currently attending Pemberton Elementary.
	H	A	Feeder patterns have got to be taken into consideration as I can see on all three options that some neighborhoods continue to stay the same. My kids have been split from elementary. Once again we will not have transportation to finish at their original school.
		C	I would prefer to continue to attend Godwin (one reason we bought our house in 2005). I like this option the LEAST of the 3 options due to its distance between Candlewood and the school and the need to travel on the more congested arterial of Parham Rd.
		GC	I don't like option A or D because I would prefer to continue to attend Godwin (one reason we bought our house in 2005). I prefer this option to option C though due to the closer proximity to our neighborhood and the less traveled roads (less travel time on Parham).
Canterbury	H	A	Disrupts feeder pattern of Pinchbeck/Byrd/Godwin. Small population of Pinchbeck goes to Freeman. Three times as far-- higher transportation costs. Kids establish friends and have to start new friendships at a critical age. Still overcrowds Godwin (2010-2013).
		A	Has Canterbury attending Freeman. Canterbury is within 1 mile of Godwin, traditional walking distance. Pump Rd. has sidewalk infrastructure across Gayton to accommodate those within walking distance. Canterbury has gone to Godwin since its opening in 1980. Houses were bought with firm expectation that homes within walking distance would continue to go to home school regardless of boundary changes.
		A	Option A for Canterbury directly violates 5 guidelines for this venture: Natural boundaries, contiguous zones, walking school, efficient bus transportation, and K-12 continuity. We are 1 mile and 1 stoplight from Godwin. We are 3.3 miles and 9 stop lights from Freeman. This poses a much bigger danger to travel and higher expense for us. My 7th grade daughter will be going to a different high school than everyone of her close friend. this is not continuity! That is an unnecessary change that will be extremely painful and difficult for our entire family. We moved to this neighborhood more than 10 years ago because of the school district and it was established with no changes planned. I walked to this meeting tonight and anticipate my kids walking to and from school as many of their older friends do now. This change violates every common sense redistricting guideline - period.

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Canterbury	H	C	Higher transportation costs (three times as far) with gas prices rising. Safer to learn to drive (first experience is driving school) with shorter commute. Disrupts feeder system of Pinchbeck Elementary. Still overcrowds Godwin (2010-2013)
		C	My children would have to travel over 4 times farther to attend Freeman vs. Godwin and this would create an unnecessary burden on my family regarding transportation issues for after school activities and athletic practice.
		C	Option C does not fulfill the committee's objective of geographic zoning, and requires students in the Canterbury community to be bused through 7 stop lights in a congested area to Freeman High School rather than keep them at their currently zoned school, Godwin which is about 1 mile away.
	H	C	With this option, the Canterbury and Kingsley neighborhoods (which are located less than 1/2 mile from Godwin and are within walking distance) are being moved from Freeman HS which is about 6-7 miles away. At the same time, this option shows expanding the Godwin district all the way up to Broad St. which would include the West Broad Village mixed development. This increases the Godwin school boundary by 1-2 miles to include this new development area...How does that make sense? You move Canterbury and Kingsley (old established neighborhood) that have been giving to Godwin for years and are located very close to this high school. Don't move old existing neighborhoods away from their district just to pickup a new development that is 5-6 miles away from Godwin HS.
		GC	I think options A and C are poor due to the fact that out of 7 Redistricting Procedural Guidelines, 5 are not being followed. Options A and C show no reasonable effort to ensure geographic zones to decrease division of Godwin's community. Canterbury is also within walking distance to Godwin and options A and C do not ensure efficient system to school bus. Let's not add more congestion to the streets of Richmond. I live one stop light away from Godwin and 9 from Freeman. This makes no logical sense. Options A and C also break the issue of ensuring continuity of a child's education k-12. My children would be made to attend a school where most of the kids she would have never have seen. According to the Procedural Guidelines, keeping Canterbury in the Godwin zone makes the most sense. Please reevaluate options A and C. Thank you.
		GC	Taking the students that live within walking distance of Godwin (we are just under 1 mile) and moving them further away to a school that crosses several intersections and roads with additional morning traffic does not make sense. We are already part of a community that is integrated with Godwin students and would like to keep this as our high school
		GC	We bought our house near Godwin (walking distance) fully expecting our kids to go to Godwin High School. When we heard about the redistricting we did not think at all to be effected and were shocked to be considered for a much further high school. We are AGAINST this option.
Canterbury East	H	C	Dislike because Canterbury moves to Freeman. This plan shifts things way too dramatically. Would be fine if Carver and Canterbury stay at Godwin. I can hear the football games from my house for goodness sakes

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Canterbury East	H	C	This option pulls 2 large apartment complexes out of Godwin and places them into Freeman. It overloads Freeman with regard to serving rental properties. It also takes Canterbury out of Godwin and there is not capacity to put both Canterbury and Carver back in Godwin without bumping out a norther area (Wellsley). We do not like this option unless both Carver and Canterbury are moved back into Godwin.
Carrington	E	D	I don't think Hartley Plantation and Winterberry should be separated from Carrington - we are all part of the same "corridor." A, B, or C is my vote.
	H	C	Clips off our neighborhood community - Hartley Plantation and Winterberry should stay with us at new HS, not Deep Run
	M	E	This option will separate our kids from most of their ES community for MS, then send them back to the new HS. Doesn't make sense. Lets not send our kids over through Innsbrook business section everyday and then bring them back across I-295 again. We need to stay as a community --Echo Lake --> Hungary Creek --> New HS
		GC	Need to include Hartley Plantation and Winterberry. Extend boundary over to I-295 as in Echo Lake ES boundaries in Options A, B, C. We are part of the same "Neighborhood Corridor"
		GC	These option will split up children who will attend elementary and high school together. For the 3 years of middle school our children will be split up from their friends. This option will also have our children on the bus longer, while Hungary Creek is just down the road and take away the neighborhood school feel. Lastly, this could make our neighborhood less attractive and potentially devalue property.
GC	These options are bad for us because our kids don't go to school with the same groups each change of school. They end up going to HS with kids they have not seen since ES. It would be better to keep them with the same group they go to MS with.

		B	Breaks up existing neighborhoods and kids, creating emotional stress.
		B	Pulling from too far away
Cavalier Park	M	B	Should stay with Tuckahoe over Hungary Creek, as transportation costs for county to bus make more sense to cut line at I-64 like options A, C, D and E.
Cedar Chase	H	GC	Options C and D separate Cedar Chase from Dover Hunt and Cross Keys. These students have all gone to Godwin together for years and are a very cohesive neighborhood.
	M	C	It splits Cedar Chase neighborhood andDover Hunt. This is like one big cohesive neighborhood.

Cedar Knoll Lane	H	GC	Option C and D splits our neighborhood in 2 and forces some of our kids from Dover Hunt to be bused twice as far to Tucker. How is this consistent with keeping down our fuel costs and other "green initiatives"?
Cedar Ridge	M	C	Pushes the student membership of the new school to near capacity in the shortest time periods.
Cedars-Innsbrook	H	A	My husband and I decided several years ago to raise our daughter in the Twin Hickory community. She has made friends established lasting relationships and would be devastated to leave her friends. In addition, my husband and I have worked countless hours to support our community (that includes Deep Run HS)
	H	GC	Strongly object to option A and D because the new HS is much further away. We would be traveling through the Deep Run district to get to the new HS
Chamberlayne Farms	M	D	Poor mix of diversity
Chappell Ridge	H	A	Deep Run is 1 mile from Chappell Ridge. The new HS is 5 miles from Chappell Ridge. The border for Deep Run should be 295 and I-64 or 295 and Broad Street. Population wise this makes the least sense.
		A	The traffic pattern/roads that students from the Wyndham Forest neighborhood would take to get to the new high school on Staples Mill would either be 295 or a 2-lane, very winding Springfield Road. This is a dangerous situation. The Wyndham Forest neighborhood should be zoned to Deep Run.
		A	This option would have a negative impact for us for several reasons: Proximity . We live only a short walk away from Deep Run HS and I can hear the band play at Friday night football games from my front porch so it would be silly to bus my kids 5-10 miles away through bad/dangerous traffic to send them to Staples Mill. I am concerned about having paid a premium for my home because it is in the Deep Run district only to potentially have my property value lowered by changing districts. Had I wanted my kids to go to school on Staples Mill Rd I would have bought a home there-- for less \$\$
Charles Glen	H	A	Does not recognize natural boundaries doesn't consider sport team boundaries. It's farther away than existing high school.
		A	Increased demand on family and resources because of additional time and distance brings stress on families.
		A	The Charles Glen residents are active in the Freeman district. The community is centered around the schools, businesses, places of play in our area. This option breaks this community of Charles Glen.
		A	There needs to be another option than Tucker. This causes a safety concern because students must endure longer transportation time and this does not keep in guidelines of the committee in by-passing Freeman.
		A	Tucker HS is farther than Freeman. Increased distances increases risks of accidents. Requires crossing of major roadways. Charles Glen children would have to cross and go in front of Freeman in route to Parham on Three Chopt. This is a huge safety concern that must be addressed.
		B	Attending Tucker pulls our students away from their long time neighborhood area friends.

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Charles Glen	H	B	Our juniors and seniors would travel major roadways to and from school as well as later at night after extracurricular activities.
		C	Closer to being in the Freeman district, but still Tucker. I bought my home specifically to be in Freeman district, I do not feel this redistricting is fair to me and my community! But if you MOVED THE LINE SLIGHTLY, Charles Glen would still be included!
		C	lines of Broad Street, I-64 and Parham. This creates a safety concern! Also the economic cost of transportation cost
		C	The economic cost of transportation cost in driving longer distance.
		C	This neighborhood is cut, so some would go to one HS and some would go to another HS. Not a good option when they are basically in the same neighborhood.
		D	I think that it is NOT FAIR for my neighborhood not to have any choice when it comes to choosing a HS. All choices would change my district from Freeman to Tucker.
		D	Our students would attend middle school with many friends who would move on to Freeman as opposed to Tucker. Teen years and transitions are challenging enough without being pulled away from friends and the community they know.
		D	This option would increase the distance our children have to travel to attend school...and require that they pass Freeman (a violation of policy). It would require us to travel major roads, increasing the risk of accidents. It would demand mor of time, fuel, and other resources already growing more expensive for families and schools. It would ignore the strong sense of community experienced by our children taking them outside of where they live, play sports, attend church, and shop to go to school.
		GC	Option C and D divides our small community and all of the above, sends our kids down 64
	GC	Sending our children to Tucker would be an unwise decision. It would increase the distance they would travel to school...and require them to pass Freeman (a violation of policy). It would require us to travel major roads increasing risk of accidents. It would take more time, more fuel, more resources when resources are growing more expensive for families and schools. It would ignore the current sense of community experienced by students.	
	M	A	Brookland MS is much farther than Tuckahoe MS increased distances increases risks of accidents. Requires crossing of major road ways. Charles Glen children would have to cross and travel on Broad St., I64, Staples Mill, Parham. To go to Tuckahoe, there are no major roadways - Have safety concern. The Charles Glen community is centered around the schools, businesses, places of play in our area. This option breaks the community that is in place in our community by putting us at Brookland. Increased demand on family and resources considering time and distance.
		A	Redistricting to Brookland Middle is an economic and transportation burden to county funds. You are transporting students across geographic boundaries such as Broad St., Parham and I-64. Students will have to bypass 2 middle schools in order to reach Brookland.
		A	The school is also located outside of our social and civic zone. The transition to high school would divide our students from many of their middle school classmates.

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Charles Glen	M	C	Moody MS is not in our support/community circle.
		E	Farther away than current school, crosses natural boundary 64/Broad St, not in our community where we shop, go to church, swim, our YMCA, doctors, pharmacist.
		GC	I moved to my house in order for my kids to go to Tuckahoe Middle School. It is close enough that they could ride their bikes - under 2 miles. I do not want them bussed 6 miles away to Brookland or Moody. That is CRAZY. Tuckahoe is by FAR the only middle school nearby.
		GC	Moody MS is much farther than Tuckahoe MS increased distances increases risks of accidents. Requires crossing of major road ways, Charles Glen children would have to cross and travel on Broad St., I64, and Staples Mill. This is a huge safety concern that must be addressed. The Charles Glen community is centered around the schools, businesses, places of play in our area. This option breaks the community of Charles Glen. Increased demand on family and resources because of additional time and distance brings stress on families.
Chartwood	H	A	I feel that the school is overcrowded with this option. It would not be beneficial to the students or staff.
		C	This option also causes the school to be overcrowded which could cause a problem with educating the children.
Chickahominy Branch	M	B	Option B uses an arbitrary split on the western side and creates a hardship for residents off Mill Rd, including Rock Spring Estates, Hunton Estates and the Chickahominy Branch subdivisions by requiring them to transport the students greater distances to get them from these subdivisions to Brookland instead of taking them to HCMS which is close in proximity.
		B	This option creates a relatively low capacity utilization rate compared to other options. The new school should be at a higher capacity rate.
		B	This proposal is inconsistent with all the other options with respect to feeder patterns for the new high school. Under this option many students would be placed with different students when transitioning from middle to high school.
Chinchilla Dr. Sandston	H	GC	For option A, C and D: Area around Seven Pines Elem. - Lee Park area-Beulah/Huntsman are currently VHS - with every options they go to HSHS not going to go over very well!!!
Church Run	E	A	It would most likely cause our children to go to a middle school (Pocahontas) where they do not retain continuity in friendships, etc. from elementary school. We have experienced this in our current pattern of Springfield Park to Pocahontas. This option separates our neighborhood and singles it out from our contiguous neighbors along the Church Rd/Three Chopt corridor. It is also farther away than Short Pump ES and would be a poor use of bus transport services. Any feeder pattern other than Short Pump ES, Pocahontas MS and Godwin HS. Does not give our children continuity in their education from K-12.

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Church Run	E	A	Option A does not hold to HCPS Guideline by properly considering major roads and natural boundaries. Option A does not minimize division of clearly identifiable community components. Three Chopt and Cox/Church Roads are the major road boundary that defines Church Run. Option A ignores that boundary creating a situation in which Church Run will be disconnected from the natural Davis ES community. Church Run will continue to be disconnected from Windsor Place. Windsor Place and Church Run are divided only by a woodline sharing walking paths, a community pool, swimteam, tennis court and other social community initiatives.
		A	With Short Pump ES being less than 2 miles from the sub division to send kids to Davis which is 4 miles away is unacceptable. The safety issue alone with busing children on school buses with out seat belts that distance along rush hour traffic roads and possibly interstate roads, is unsafe and careless. It is only a matter of time before a child is injured in a motor vehicle crash with the bus along these routes.
		B	I do not like split for Jackson Davis/Short Pump. This isolates Church Run neighborhood from Windsor Place. Splits cohesive community.
		B	J. Davis is not the natural area for Church Run to go to. They all involve Short Pump Elementary School where we went 13 years ago, is our closest school, no barriers, such as roads, between Church run over to Short Pump E.S. Also, we would be separated from neighboring Windsor Place, where we share many things, including a pool and club.
		GC	Church Run children would not be going to ES with children from adjacent communities. Going to school close to home fosters a greater sense of community, facilitates volunteering and participation w/school activities. This also does not support MS and HS feeder options.
		GC	Elementary options A & B pull our children out of the existing community and send them elsewhere. The census tract arbitrarily splits Church Run from its existing community, especially Windsor Place. The children in Church Run and Windsor Place spend every day of the summer together at the swimming pool, tennis courts, and walking trails that link the communities, which are contained between the boundaries of Church Road and Three Chopt Road.
		GC	Jackson Davis is a long way from where we live. I would prefer my elementary age child would attend a school close to home! Community: The community we live in share a pool and recreation areas with Windsor Place. They are going to Short Pump. This would split our community that spends a lot of time together with swim team.
		GC	My concern with Church Run children going to Davis are: 1) it is not the closest to our homes (longer bus ride, my part of our community) 2) The feeder pattern to middle school (our children would face going to middle school without a big group of friends. (This is the case now with the present feeder pattern) 3) We would love for our kids to go to school with their friends from the adjacent neighborhood (Windsor Place).

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Church Run	H	C	Any feeder pattern that breaks from the Short Pump ES, Pocahontas MS, and Godwin HS pattern breaks the geographical boundary created by Cox/Church Rd. which defines Church Run as a westward neighborhood in all respects. Also if our children were placed in Tucker HS with Pocahontas MS they would be attending a HS with no other students they attended MS with. This does not meet the objective of ensuring contiguous geographical zones stay together not is it an efficient use of the bus system as Tucker is much further away from Church Run than Godwin HS. We have been redistricted numerous times in the past 3 years and have experienced this lack of continuity in feeder pattern.
		C	It is too far. We are the very west subdivision listed on this proposal. Not good for carpooling for after school activities. Please keep Windsor Place and Church Run community together.
		C	The Tucker HS zone stretches almost from one of the county to the other. It includes kids and neighborhoods who otherwise would not meet. The HS community would not be united with any other common factors. Kids should go to the school as close to home as possible. It is good for the students and for the community and county as well.
		D	Is too far to go for my neighborhood. We are on the very outskirts of this line. You are separating us from Windsor Place and we have strong community ties.
		D	It would break the feeder pattern and would not be employing the most efficient school bus transportation system. Any break from this scenario would add unnecessary wear and tear on bus system and increased loss to county taxpayers.
		D	This option seems to stretch the Tucker HS zone even longer. When families and parents know each other, kids are less likely to get in trouble - there are more eyes watching them. It is important that HS kids go to school with those they went to MS and ES with. Parents don't meet other parents when their kids are in HS - there is much less parent involvement. The unity and community starts in MS and ES.
		GC	I do not want to be the "Westernmost" neighborhood and having to be involved with families that we have no interaction with. We would be separated from neighborhoods like Windsor Place, where we have many friends and interactions.
		GC	Option C and D, by sending our kids to Tucker creates an island that isolates our kids from all the other neighborhoods around us. We would be the only one sent out to Tucker. This is high school when kids should form existing friendships, all the boundaries are crossed here our kids are penalized and not allowed to continue with relationships close to home. Busing: So much closer, our kids could be dropped off at Short Pump ES, Pocahontas, Deep Run with one bus in a very short turn around time. There is really no boundary between Church Run and Windsor, we really are two phases of one development (same pool).
		GC	The community disruption translates to a disjointed sense and participation in the school community. No continuity; adds to negative student experience.
GC	This leaves our neighborhood going to a high school (Tucker) with no other students from their middle school - poor feeder pattern.		

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Church Run	M	A	Pocahontas Middle School which my daughter attended for 2 years. She loves that school and making a lot of good friends. She has gotten so use to that school. It's very close to Church Run. She'll be very upset to go to Short Pump for her last year of middle school.
